

8. Admit card .-

- (1) The admit card supplied along with the Application Form shall have to be filled up by the applicant in his/her own handwriting.
- (2) The admit card along with the photograph, as provided by the candidate, shall be scanned into two copies. (by the Examination Conducting Authority) Of these, one shall be given to the candidate, while the other shall be sent to the centre of examination allotted to the candidate.
- (3) The original copy of the admit card shall be kept along with the Application Form. (Form A)
- (4) The candidate shall provide his/her full signature on the Form and on the admit card and shall have to write his/her name in clear and legible manner. There should also be a uniformity of the signatures in all documents pertaining to the admission process including entrance examination.
- (5) The candidate shall have to sign on his/her own copy of admit card with black sign pen inside the box provided for this purpose. The candidate shall also have to sign in the admit card copy available in the centre of examination during each sitting of examination in the presence of the invigilator. In addition to that the candidate shall also provide his/her left thumb impression on the attendance sheet by the side of his/her name and Roll No. in the Examination hall.
- (6) Admit cards shall be watermarked.
- (7) In case the Admit Card is not received by a candidate five days before the date of examination he/she may contact the Examination Conducting Authority for Duplicate Admit Card along with two photographs and a fee of Rs. 5/- (Rupees five) only in cash for Duplicate Admit Card.
- (8) On being selected for counseling, a candidate must bring his/her copy of the admit card at the time of the same, without fail.

9. Physical marks .-

- (1) The candidate is required to list two physical marks (such as moles, scars or cut marks) in the requisite spaces given in the admit card and Application Form, for establishing his/her identity.

10. Declaration of results .-

- (1) Once the results of the Entrance Examination are finalized, they shall be declared on the Internet. A website shall be designed and erected for this purpose by the Examination Conducting Authority.
- (2) Only after declaration on the Internet, shall hard copies of the results be printed and released.

11. Transfer .-

Under no circumstances shall a candidate admitted in a particular Medical College be transferred to any other Medical College as per the norms laid down by the Medical Council of India.

12. Appeal .-

The Govt. shall dispose of all appeals, if any, received from any candidate aggrieved by the decision of the Board within a period of 7 days from the date of its receipt.

13. Bond .-

After being selected, candidates (except those nominated against 15% All India Quota Seats/Central Pool and N.E. States Quota), under the existing rules of the Government of Assam, shall execute a duly registered bond, on a non-judicial stamp paper of the value of Rs 10 (Rupees ten only), in the form at Schedule II appended to these rules for binding himself/herself to serve under the Government of Assam for a period of 5 years on completion of the under-graduate course, and in breach thereof, to pay a sum of a maximum of Rs. 7,00,000 (Rupees seven lacks only) to the Government as compensation.

14. Miscellaneous .-

- (1) Applications must be filled up by the candidate in his/her own handwriting, and shall be accompanied by all necessary certificates, documents and fees as may be prescribed in the Rules and in the advertisement. Application forms incomplete in any respect shall be summarily rejected and no communication in this regard shall be entertained.
- (2) The authority/institute shall not be responsible for any delay in receipt or loss of the application during postal transit. No correspondence in this regard shall be entertained.
- (3) No claim of refund shall be entertained, in the case of fees that has already been paid.

15. Competent authority to issue Caste and other Certificates .-

Only the following authorities are declared competent to issue Caste Certificate which should be countersigned by the respective Deputy Commissioner and S.D.O's (civil), as the case may be .-

- (3) For Other Backward Class/More Other Backward Class:
- OBC, MLA's & MP's within the jurisdiction of the respective district. (No Counter Signature necessary)
 - Deputy Commissioner, Sub-Divisional Officer are competent to issue certificates for OBC/MOBC.
 - Chairman of Sub-Divisional Development Board for the welfare of the Other Backward Classes within the respective Sub-Division.

- (d) Member of All Assam State Advisory Council for the welfare of Other Backward Classes within the respective district to which the Member belongs.
- (e) President & Secretary of All Assam Other Backward Class Association within the jurisdiction concerned.
- (f) President & Secretary of District/Sub-Divisional Other Backward Classes Association within their respective jurisdiction.

In case of Sl. No. (c), (d), (e) & (f) the countersigning authority will be the Deputy Commissioner/Sub-Divisional Officer. (Vide Notification No. TAD/MISC/275/85/296, dated Dispur the 5th January, 1995.

- (4) For Freedom Fighter's Quota : The issuing Authority is the Principal Private Secretary to the Chief Minister, Assam. Competent Authority to issue direct relationship of the candidate with the Freedom Fighter is the Deputy Commissioner or his authorised official of the concerned district.
- (5) For Physically Handicapped Quota : The Candidates applying for seats under physical disability (Physically Handicapped) Quota will have to produce identity certificate from the State Level Medical Board/District Level Medical Board as constituted in pursuance of Social Welfare Department's Notification No. SWD.181/96/75, dated 12-06-1990 along with a certificate regarding P. C. (%) of disability issued from the Head of the Department of Orthopaedics of any of the Medical Colleges of Assam. The Medical Board will have to follow the working principles and instructions for issuance of identity certificate to physically disabled persons as issued by Social Welfare Department OM. No. SWD.181/96/55, dated 31-03-1999. The valid disability certificates of the candidates are to be obtained from the Medical Board as stated above as well as from Head of Orthopaedic Department of any Medical College of Assam having been issued within 3 months prior to presenting his/her application for seeking admission.

Provided that the Government in the Health Department shall constitute a Medical Board consisting of not less than three experts in Orthopaedic Surgery nominating from the three Medical Colleges of Assam for assessment of disability of the student seeking admission, at the time of counseling. If there is any doubt in certificate indicating the degree of disability issued by the Medical Board constituted by Social Welfare Department, opinion of the aforesaid Medical Board constituted by the government shall be final for selection of the candidate.

- (6) For Char Area Quota : The candidate applying seats under Char Areas Quota must produce the certificates from the Competent Authority i.e. form concerned D.C./S.D.O. (Civil) certifying that the candidate is from socially, economically and educationally backward family ordinarily residing in areas covered by the Assam State Char Development Authority. The name of his/her parents must be enrolled in the voters' list of their respective Char Areas Village.
- (7) For Martyr's Quota, Extremists Violence Quota, Moran Community Quota and Motak Community Quota : The candidate must produce certificate from the Competent Authority i.e. D.C. of the concerned districts.

(8) For TGL, Ex-TGL Category : The certifying Authority is the Deputy Commissioner of the concerned district and the Director of Tea Welfare, Govt. of Assam will be the countersigning Authority.

(9) For Rural Areas Quota : The candidates applying seats under Rural Area Quota must produce the certificate as at Annexure-IX from the Inspector of Schools to be countersigned by the Deputy Commissioner/S.D.O.(Civil) certifying that the school from where the candidate has passed HSLC examination is situated under the area mentioned in Rule 6(m)(i) and (ii).

16. Power to relax .-

Where the Government is of the opinion that it is necessary or expedient so to do it may by order, not inconsistent with the provisions of the these rules and for reasons to be recorded in writing, relax any of the provisions of these rules.

18. Forfeiture of seats and drawing up of Criminal proceedings .-

If at any stage during Common Entrance Examination and during and after the process of selection it is found that a candidate or his/her guardian has furnished a false statement in the Application, or in the Certificates, Marksheets, Permanent Resident Certificate (PRC) and other documents furnished with the Application are false or fabricated, the seat, if any, given to such applicant shall be forfeited forthwith without any refund of any fee etc. paid in this regard and criminal proceedings shall be drawn against such candidates/ his/her parents.
